Moving and handling in health and social care: What you ...

Allow the person you are assisting to do as much of the moving as possible Proper Moves to Turn or Position Reclining Elderly Adults When moving a person reclining in bed, be aware of your competencies. Communicate with the adult as much as possible as you move around the room and position yourself and the person.

How to Safely Lift and Transfer Elderly Adults

If you've assessed the situation and have decided to move the person, make sure you: never lift above shoulder height keep your feet stable have a firm hold keep any weight close to your body keep your back straight and bend your knees lift as smoothly as possible
